- Non-profit organisation established in 2003 to
 - Promote integrated transport R&D in Europe
 - Tie together the foremost multi-modal transport research centers across Europe
 - Promote the excellence of European transport research
- 24 major European transport research institutes / Universities from 19 European countries
- Employing more than 4,000 research staff
- Offices and staff located in Brussels

Thematic Groups

- Mobility (Understanding travel behaviour, Inter-modal aspects of urban mobility, Landuse and transport interaction)
- Freight and logistics (E-freight, Door-to-door freight transport and supply chains, Urban logistics, Terminals)
- **Economics and policy** (Policy analyses e.g. scenarios, foresights, Cost benefit analyses, Public Private Partnership, Pricing and externalities)
- Safety (Behavioural adaption and change, Fitness to drive, Evaluation of policy initiatives, Ageing society, Injury data)
- Security and risks analysis (Risk Analysis and Management, Critical infrastructures, Needs of users/ operators/ owners/ emergency services)

Role

- Define research topics of interest for influencing EC policies and programmes
- Increase successful participation in EU projects
- Provide a platform for networking and scientific exchanges



Task Forces

Horizon 2020 Task Force Scope and objectives:

Advise on how to best promote the interests of ECTRI and to influence the developments of H2020 programme and most particularly:

- to overlook the inputs of TG (consistency, appropriate format, aggregation/consolidation of contributions) and make recommendations;
- to overlook EU developments and advise on actions to undertake (assess opportunities);
- to assess matching of inputs with EU developments and make recommendations



Young Researchers Seminar


- The Young Researchers Seminar: promoting scientific excellence and support Young Researchers to put science into practice by:

 - To enable the networking of young transport researchers belonging to ECTRI, FERSI and FEHRL members and from TRB

Biennial event jointly organized with FERSI and FEHRL since 2003

Disseminating research results

ETRR - ECTRI sponsored scientific Journal

- An open access journal; wide availability to all researchers with a minimum of constraints and costs
- Provides focus on issues of special interest to European transport research, its funding bodies and supervising organisations
- First 5 Volumes (4 issues both) in 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, (2014: 3 issues available)
- Published by Springer Verlag through contract with ECTRI the language of science
