Ingrid Skogsmo is President of ECTRI and senior research leader for future mobility at VTI, the Swedish National Road and Transport Research Institute. Her experience includes 25 years in the automotive industry, within positions such as president Corporate Strategy at Volvo Group; Director, Volvo Cars Safety Center and manager positions at Ford Motor Company, Dearborn, USA. Ingrid has furthermore worked as seconded expert for automated driving at the European Commission, DG RTD, and been deeply involved in R&I projects, both as deputy director for the collaborative research platform SAFER Vehicle & Traffic Safety Research Center at Chalmers, and as a biomechanics specialist at Volvo Cars. Ingrid has a Master of Science from Chalmers, Sweden, where she was awarded a honorary doctorate for pioneering safety work in 2008.



Magda Kopczyńska
Director General for Mobility and Transport
European Commission

Magda Kopczyńska is the Director-General for Mobility and Transport within the European Commission, since 01/08/2023. Her Directorate-General is responsible for the EU policy on mobility and transport and aims to promote a mobility that is efficient, safe, secure and environmentally friendly and to create the conditions for a competitive European transport industry generating growth and jobs. After joining the European Commission in 2006, to work in the Directorate-General for Internal Market and Services, in May 2009 Ms Kopczyńska was appointed Head of Unit for Clean Transport and Sustainable Urban Mobility in the Directorate-General for Mobility and Transport (DG MOVE). In July 2011 she became Head of Unit dealing with Maritime Transport policy and Logistics, until taking up the post of Director for Sustainable and Innovative Mobility in May 2014 until 15 October 2016. Between 16 October 2016 and December 2022 she was Director for Waterborne transport until her nomination to the post of Deputy Director-General for Agriculture and Rural Development which she occupied from January until July 2023.

Anu Tuominen (D.Sc.Tech.) is a principal scientist at the VTT Technical Research Centre of Finland Ltd. Prior to the present position she has worked for VTT as a research team leader and senior scientist and as a transport consultant in the private sector. Her professional experience lies in the fields of urban sustainable mobility transition, transport policy analysis, transport system-level impact assessment, socio-technical change, and foresight and in which areas, she has coordinated and participated in several national and international research projects during the past 25 years. He has led a range of national and international projects and is currently Co-Director of the Newcastle Centre for Research Excellence in Transport and Mobility as well as the National Research Hub for Decarbonised, Adaptable and Resilient Transport Infrastructures (DARe) co-funded by EPSRC and UK's Department for Transport (DfT).

Alexandra Millonig

Alexandra Millonig is with the Digital Resilient Cities (DRC) team at the Center for Energy of the AIT Austrian Institute of Technology. As one of the key researchers of this interdisciplinary team comprising almost 40 scientists, Alexandra is responsible for the conceptual design, implementation and management of national and international research projects related to cross-sectoral topics in the area of (spatial) behaviour and sustainable behaviour change. In addition, she gives lectures on sustainable city development and behaviour change. Alexandra holds a master's degree in Urban and Regional Planning and a PhD on pedestrian typologies from the Vienna University of Technology and has been involved as Expert Advisor in the implementation of the European Joint Programming Initiative "Urban Europe" and the development of the Urban Europe Strategic Research Framework. As of 2021, she leads the ECTRI Mobility Thematic Group.

Jane Amilhat currently serves as the Head of Unit for Low Emission Future Industries at the European Commission's Directorate General for Research and Innovation (DG RTD). She joined the European Commission in 2006, when she worked for the Directorate General for Environment (DG ENV), focusing on international climate change negotiations and sectoral climate policies. Later, at DG TRADE, she handled responsibilities related to Russia, the Eastern Partnership, Western Balkans, and Switzerland. Prior to her current role, she was Deputy Head of Unit in the Directorate General for Energy (DG ENER), overseeing Energy Infrastructures and Regional Cooperation. Before her positions in the European Commission, she worked in the industrial and energy sectors at companies like Danone, Gaz de France/Engie, and RWE Trading.



Angel Aparicio

Professor of Transport Planning & Economics
Technical University Madrid (UPM)

A civil engineer, with a PhD in transport and city planning and a MA in Political Philosophy, **Angel Aparicio** worked for 20 years as a civil servant at the Spanish Ministries of Transport and Environment, and as a part-time associate professor in the fields of transport and urban planning. Between 2004 and 2009, Angel served as Director General of the National Research Centre of the Spanish Ministries of Transport and Environment (CEDEX). Since June 2009 he is teaching transport planning and policy at the Technical University of Madrid. He has participated as transport expert in the evaluation and implementation of several European transport research projects, and served as member of rapporteur of the FP7 Transport Research Advisory Committee. Until 2014, he contributed as transport expert to the European Topic Centre of Climate Change Adaptation of the European Environmental Agency. He is supporting both UN Development and Environmental Programmes in the design, implementation and evaluation of climate change mitigation projects in Africa, Eastern Europe, Central Asia, the Caucasus and the Americas. As of 2023, he leads the ECTRI European Policy Task Force.

Stephen Perkins is Senior Counsellor at the International Transport Forum. The object is to improve the evidence base for public policy making.
